

SMALL GROUP CURRICULUM

Sermon: The Christian's Global Conquest (Matthew 5:5)

Date: May 6, 2018

Jesus is up on the mountain teaching his disciples what it means to live as a citizen of God's kingdom. He begins his famous sermon on the mount by offering up a description of what a blessed life truly looks like. So far, we've learned that those who have poverty of spirit and those who mourn are blessed. This week we will study the third beatitude: "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth," (Matthew 5:5). In the study this week, we will learn where Jesus derives this third beatitude from. As we do so, we will learn what meekness is and how meek people live. Jesus teaches us that meekness is the blessed state and those who are meek will one day inherit everything.

Individual Bible Study

1.	Please read	Matthew 5:5	and ensure	that you've	listened to	Sunday's sermon.

- a. Review: What are the Beatitudes?
- b. Review: What does it mean to be "blessed"? How should we define this word?
- c. Read Psalm 37. List out the statements in this Psalm that are similar to Matthew 5:5.
- d. What is the context of Psalm 37? How does this help us understand what "meekness" means?
- e. What is meekness? How should we define meekness?
- f. What are some statements in Psalm 37 that specifically describe meekness?
- g. What are we to think when we see the wicked prospering all around us? How can we exercise patience when the wicked prosper and the righteous suffer?



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	h.	How can someone assess whether or not they are meek? What kinds of questions can they ask themselves to help discern this? What sorts of character traits are true of the meek?
	i.	What does it mean to "inherit the earth"?
	j.	Consider the previous two characteristics of the blessed life: (1) poverty of spirit and (2) mourning. How might being poor in spirit and mourning over sin and its effects lead to meekness?
