Group Discussion Questions

- 1. How did the Holy Spirit speak to you through the teaching and bible passage this week?
- 2. Onesimus was one of Philemon's *slaves*. Pastor Randy spoke to difference between slavery in the Roman era and the slavery experienced in America. Compare and contrast the two.
- 3. How does Paul address Philemon, a slave owner, in verses 4-7? What can we learn from Paul's example here, especially when we think through what to do with historical figures that also owned slaves?
- 4. What could Paul *command* Philemon to do if he wanted to in verse 8? What are some Scriptures he could have used to bring the command to bear upon the situation?
- 5. Read verse 9. Why does Paul decide to make a heartfelt *appeal* to Philemon instead of simply commanding him to forgive Onesimus? What can we learn from this?
- 6. What do we learn about Onesimus in verses 10-11? What implications does this change in Onesimus' life have on Philemon's relationship with Onesimus?
- 7. How does a trust in God's providence serve to help us as we seek to reconcile and forgive one another? Explain. Use Scripture.

- 8. How was Onesimus expected to make things right in the relationship? What does this teach us about the consequences of sin and what it might take to *fully* reconcile with someone that we've wronged?
- 9. What are the consequences of unforgiveness? What can happen if we harbour unforgiveness in our hearts?
- 10. What do you do if the person that sinned against you hasn't yet asked for your forgiveness? How can you guard your heart in this situation from bitterness?
- 11. If you knew someone in the Lord that was having a hard time forgiving someone else, how would you counsel and encourage them? What Scriptures might you point them toward? How would you bring the gospel to bear upon the situation?
